

- 1) movement in which individual responsibility for seeking salvation was emphasized, along with the need for personal and social improvement
- 4) a system of production in which manufacturers provide the materials for goods to be produced in the home
- 6) people who migrated to California in search of riches after gold was discovered in 1848
- 8) major change in the US economy produced by people's beginning to buy and sell goods rather than make them for themselves
- 11) women's rights convention
- 12) refusal to obey those laws which are seen as unjust in an effort to bring about a change in governmental policy
- 15) movement to end slavery
- 17) skilled artisan, usually one owning a business and employing others
- 18) device for the electrical transmission of coded messages over wires
- 19) gift of public land to an individual or organization
- 20) to incorporate a territory into an existing political unit, such as a state or a nation
- 21) belonging to the period before the Civil War
- 22) religious gathering designed to reawaken faith through impassioned preaching

- 1) in farming, the raising of one or two crops for sale rather than a variety of foods for personal use
- 2) belief that married women should restrict their activities to their home and family
- 3) limiting or preventing debate on an issue
- 5) work stoppage intended to force an employer to respond to demands
- 7) philosophical and literary movement of the 1800s that emphasized living a simple life and celebrated the truth found in nature and in personal emotion and imagination
- 9) the freeing of slaves
- 10) a skilled worker employed by a master
- 12) economic system in which private individuals and corporations control the means of production and use them to earn profits
- 13) person who organizes, operates, and assumes the risk of a business venture
- 14) members of a church founded by Joseph Smith and his associates in 1830
- 15) worker learning a trade or a craft, usually under the supervision of a master
- 16) movement of many people to a region in which gold has been discovered
